Some what of a late starter, Ross' interest in singing initiated around 9 years ago with singing lessons and talent contests. One of these contests led him to join "vocal connection", a local singing group which introduced him to Savoyards to appear in their

production of *South Pacific* playing the lead role. Next Ross appeared in *Les Misérables* as well as joining the Savoyard Singers, a group which he has now been with for 4 years, singing at the annual Canungra Valley Vineyard Event and other concerts.

Kathleen Lamont - Mary Magdalene



Kathleen has a long association with music. She has been involved in several choirs including the Brisbane Conservatorium Youth Choir, sings for weddings throughout the Brisbane area, and has been involved in many Eisteddfods, and most recently was a member of the London Philharmonic

Choir. Kathleen is currently teaching classroom music at Whites Hill State College. Her association with Savoyards began in 1997 when she played the role Liesel in *The Sound Of Music*. Since then she has performed as Eliza in *My Fair Lady*, and as the understudy for Eponine in *Les Misérables*.


Lawrie Esmond - Caiaphas

to Sydney to undergo professional training at Three Stage Theatre School. For the past four years, he has appeared in professional productions of *Ladies Night*, *The Odd Couple*, and *Dad's Army* with Jon English. Greg was last seen with Savoyards in their 2005 production of *Oklahoma!* as Jud Fry.

Greg Tooley - Pontius Pilate



Greg's first professional stage appearance was at the Twelfth Night Theatre in 1978. He stopped keeping count after 100 productions, both amateur and professional, including musical, dramas and comedies. As one half of




Greg Johnson - Isaac (a priest)



From The Director Liz Quinn



To say Jesus Christ Superstar was a challenge would be an understatement. Bringing this vibrant, rock opera to the stage has been a labour of love for the cast and production team because of the intensely emotional and in many cases, personal nature of the material. Why a rock opera? Why are they in modern clothes? To paraphrase the composer and lyricist, they were fascinated with the character of Judas Iscariot and the thoughts that might have gone through his head. They felt the hard rock style complimented by modern dress would reach a whole new audience in the same way as Shakespeare has been re-popularised and made more relevant to today through modern interpretations. We have been very fortunate in being able to assemble a first class cast and crew and I believe Savoyards is

once again bringing you, our valued audience, 'A Great Night at the Theatre'.

Following the lead set by her mother. Ada Groenhart, Liz has been actively involved in all aspects of community and professional theatre for more than 50 years. Liz was most recently seen as Aunt Eller in the very successful Savovards' production of Oklahoma!.

From The Musical Director Jacqui Cuny



Musically speaking, the score of Jesus Christ Superstar is extremely challenging for any theatre company and band to tackle. From the first discordant notes and angst-filled electric guitar melodies, the music is filled with an intensity and drive that carries its audience on a passionate journey. Andrew Lloyd Webber tries to capture the freedom of the spoken language by constantly changing rhythms and throwing songs into odd times. He uses "leitmotifs" or symbolic sounds to represent characters the most obvious being the lead guitar's riffs, which tell us of Judas's inner turmoil. In this particular arrangement, we have tried to combine the emotional sweep and texture of an orchestra with the passionate drive of a rock band, which is the heartbeat of the musical. Enjoy!

Jacqui fell in love with performing at the age of five and has been working and dabbling in all aspects of musical theatre for the last 25 years. She began her professional acting career with the QTC in Annie. Moving to Sydney, Jacqui appeared in the Nimrod's Candide and the Australian national tours of The Sound of Music and The Pirates of Penzance, before heading to England where she spent five years treading the boards. Her credits there include The Pirates of Penzance and Starlight Express. She also wrote, recorded and toured her first jazzrock album 'Another Statistic'. Returning to Sydney, she was cast in the original productions of Buddy - the Buddy Holly Story, and Return to the Forbidden Planet, and played opposite Toni Lamond in Better Known as Bee. She played the role of Maria for Savoyards in The Sound of Music, and appeared in Harvest Rain's Oliver! and Into the Woods. Her most recent performance was in My Way - A Musical Tribute to Frank Sinatra at Twelfth Night Theatre.

From The Choreographer Philippa Hall



Having studied classical, tap, modern and jazz ballet for 19 years. Philippa went on to perform interpretive dance at National Christian Youth Conventions around Australia. She also performed in and choreographed a number of Christian Youth musicals in Brisbane. She choreographed and performed the role of Peggy in The Independent Theatre production of Godspell. Her passion and love for musicals has never waned and Jesus Christ Superstar sees her return to choreography after a number of years pursuing other interests here and overseas.

"... A Monumental Piece Of Theatre ..."

Jesus Christ Superstar is a rock opera in two acts with music by Andrew Lloyd Webber and lyrics by Tim Rice and based on the last seven days in the life of Jesus of Nazareth.

The show opened on 12 October 1971 at the Mark Hellinger Theatre, New York and was the first musical by Rice and Lloyd Webber to be produced on the professional stage. The recording of the score of the show with Ian Gillan (Jesus), Murray Head (Judas) and Yvonne Elliman (Mary Magdalene) topped the American album charts three times. The production opened in London on 9 August 1972 with Paul Nicholas (Jesus), Stephen Tate (Judas) and Dana Gillespie (Mary Magdalene). By the time it closed after some eight years and 3,358 performances, it had become the longest running musical in West End

Jesus Christ Superstar has been reproduced regularly, around the world, in the 20 years since its first appearance. In Australia there have been a series of vastly successful Harry M Miller staged concerts of the show with local megastar John Farnham in the role of Jesus. A new production re-opened the refurbished Lyceum Theatre in Autumn 1996 directed by Gale Edwards and designed by John Napier, The production was then re-worked and redesigned and toured the UK during 1998 and 1999. The show played Dublin in August 1999 and in January 2000 opened at the Colosseum Theatre in Essen, Germany for a six month season.

About Savoyards

Our Society was established in Wynnum /Manly in 1961, by local lovers of musical theatre, to give amateur singers, actors and musicians opportunities to enjoy the theatrical pleasures of rehearsing and performing. 'Savoyards' was the name given to the performers in the D'Ovly Carte Opera Company from the early 1880's, when they performed comic operas of Gilbert & Sullivan and other writers at the Savoy Theatre in London.

Two major productions have been presented per year since 1961. We have produced Gilbert & Sullivan comic operas, operettas, Broadway & West End musicals, Music Hall and variety concerts. We strive to maintain a high standard of production and performance as amateurs, musically, dramatically and in all technical areas.

It is estimated that over a quarter of a million people have attended Savoyards shows and many support the society with subscriptions or membership. The Society, incorporated in 1986, is self-funding & takes quality musical theatre primarily to the Bayside community.

From humble beginnings, Savoyards has gone on to success, performing seventy different musicals, many two or three times, in nineteen venues around southeast Queensland.

In 2001 the company celebrated its fortieth birthday, making it the longest continual-running musical theatre company in Brisbane.
