

She began her directing career with *South Pacific* (Co-director) and has since gone on to be part of the creative teams for *Oklahoma!* (2005, Director), *HMS Pinafore* (2007, Director), *Cabaret* (2007, Assistant Director), *42nd Street* (2010, Assistant Director) and *My Fair Lady* (2011, Director). Johanna returns to directing with this production of the ever popular *Thoroughly Modern Millie*.



Jo Badenhorst I Choreographer

Jo started ballet classes at 5 years old, and since then has trained extensively in ballet, contemporary, jazz, tap, gymnastics, and more recently, Argentinean Tango. Her musical theatre credits with Savoyards include *The Boy From Oz, 42nd Street, Carousel, Act 1 Concert, Miss Saigon, Anything Goes* (Angel), and most recently *The Phantom of the Opera* (Dance Captain).

He is co-founder of Smash Theatrical with his wife, Joanna in 2012, presenting their first production at the Schonell Theatre in early 2013. Shane's first association with Savoyards was as Musical Director for their 2002 production of Les Misérables. He returned in 2005 as Musical Director of Oklahoma! His other theatre credits include The Pajama Game, Me & My Girl, The Pirates of Penzance, Singin' in the Rain, West Side Story and Hairspray.

Shane would like to dedicate each performance of Thoroughly Modern Millie to his gorgeous girls trio, Joanna, Maddy & Izzy.

Synopsis &

ACT 1

Mille Dillmount, a plucky Kansas small town girl, arrives in 1922 Manhattan with big dreams to be chic and 'modern' ("Not For The Life of Me" and "Thoroughly Modern Millie"). In the excitement, Millie gets mugged. Jimmy Smith, a brash city slicker with an irrepressible, buoyant personality, tells her to go back to Kansas. She refuses, so he suggests she check into the Hotel Priscilla - a rooming house for actresses run by Mrs Meers, a former actressturned-criminal who pretends to be a kindly Chinese woman to mask her true profession: a white slave trader.

Millie's rent is overdue and she tries to persuade 'Meersie' to let her stay. The ingénue Miss Dorothy Brown, an orphan, arrives and Millie makes a deal with her to share her room, as long as Dorothy sleeps on the floor. Miss Dorothy is excited to make the acquaintance of her first poor person ("How The Other Half Lives"). Millie explains that she plans to marry her boss as they head upstairs via the elevator, tap dancing their way up. In the laundry, Ching Ho and Bun Foo fold towels. The boys, who speak and sing in Chinese with subtitles, are working here to save money to bring their mother over from Hong Kong ("Not For The Life of Me – Reprise").

Later, Millie tries to interview Trevor Graydon, President of Sincere Trust Insurance, who happens to be single and is a business man who needs a stenographer. Miss Flannery, the office manager, thinks Millie is a 'modern' and disapproves. Mr Graydon gives Millie a convoluted typing test, which she passes with flying colours ("The Speed Test"), landing her the job.

Back at the hotel, Ching Ho brings Miss Dorothy an apple which Mrs Meers has injected with a drug. However, when he sees Miss Dorothy, he is instantly smitten. Mrs Meers laments her former acting career, applauding herself for

use in her current line of work

("They Don't Know").

Millie, Miss Dorothy and the girls head out to celebrate Millie's job. They bump into Jimmy, who gets them inside a club. Millie and Jimmy dance together ("The Nutty Cracker Suite") when the joint is raided. While mug shots are taken, Jimmy and Millie get better acquainted. In the jail cell, Jimmy watches Millie sleep and tries to convince himself that he is not falling for her ("What Do I Need With Love"). When he discovers that Millie is 'in love' with her boss, he invites her and Miss Dorothy to Long Island to a ball game.

At the Priscilla, Mrs Meers enters holding a rag and bottle, intending to knock Miss Dorothy out and cart her away. When asked about the bottle, Mrs Meers claims it is soy sauce, and good for cleaning. Millie has been seeing a lot of Jimmy, who has scored them an invitation to a welcome home party for Muzzy Van Hossmere in her glamorous penthouse. The glamorous Muzzy sings the praises of the New York City ("Only In New York") entertaining New York's elite. She confides to Millie that though the deceased Mr Van Hossmere was very wealthy, she married him for love before she knew his means. During the dancing, Millie spills champagne on the famous author Dorothy Parker's dress. Muzzy tells Jimmy that he is in love with Millie, and asks what he is going to do about it.

On the terrace, Jimmy calms Millie down after she has tried to clean Miss Parker's dress disastrously with soy sauce. The conversation turns to Graydon and they argue when Jimmy grabs Millie and kisses her passionately. She responds and Jimmy exits in a panic.

Millie realizes she is in love with Jimmy ("Jimmy"). Back at Hotel Priscilla,
Millie walks in to see Jimmy leaving
Miss Dorothy's room, asking her
not to tell Millie. Shocked and
broken hearted, Millie watches
him go.

MUSICAL MUMBERS

ACT 2

At Sincere Trust, Millie will not pick up the phone to talk to Jimmy. Office manager Miss Flannery and the other girls urge her to move on. They all have boys in their life that they need to forget ("Forget About The Boy").

Meanwhile, Millie's attempts to flirt with Graydon fall flat. Jimmy shows up which only interferes further with her plan. Graydon enters and sees Miss Dorothy. They stare at one another and are smitten ("Ah! Sweet Mystery of Life"/"I'm Falling In Love With Someone"). Jimmy realizes that he loves Millie ("I Turned A Corner"). The two decide to dine at the Café Society that night where Muzzy will be performing. Millie, Jimmy, Graydon and Miss Dorothy profess their love while Ching Ho professes his own love for Miss Dorothy ("I'm Falling In Love With Someone - Reprise").

Back at the Hotel Priscilla, Mrs Meers stalks Miss Dorothy, this time with pesticide spray guns. When Ching Ho balks, Mrs Meers reminds him that he is trying to get his mother to New York and to recommit to the job ("Muquin"). That night at Café Society, Muzzy performs her number ("Long As I'm Here With You"). Millie and Jimmy listen to her sing from the kitchen where they are washing dishes. Muzzy tells Millie that her plan to marry her boss is flawed because even though she originally thought Mr Van Hossmere was poor, she married him for love and never regretted it. Millie realizes that she must follow her heart ("Gimme Gimme").

In another part of Café Society, Graydon, unusually drunk, is singing about a lost love; Miss Dorothy has stood him up. He even went to the hotel and she had checked out. Jimmy is convinced something is very wrong. Millie realizes that two orphan girls disappeared without a word to anyone but Mrs Meers. The three of them decide they need a decoy orphan.

Muzzy enters the Hotel Priscilla disguised as an ingénue and is offered green tea. Upstairs, Ching Ho vows to help Miss Dorothy. Mrs Meers finally recognizes Muzzy and Muzzy realizes Mrs Meers is Daisy Crumpler who was kicked out of the chorus. Mrs Meers reveals her new profession. Millie, hiding in a laundry cart, transcribes the entire conversation ("The Speed Test – Reprise"). While they search for Miss Dorothy, Mrs Meers escapes. Miss Dorothy is discovered in an embrace with Ching Ho who has rescued her from an unspeakable fate ("Ah! Sweet Mystery – Reprise"). The Priscilla girls

Love has conquered all; relationships are revealed as true love prevails. Our vision of the twenties ends with the 'Moderns' singing "Thoroughly Modern Millie".



Millie Dillmount I Astin Blaik

Astin graduated from CQU with distinction in a Bachelor of Music Theatre. During her time there Astin's credits included; *Chess, Kiss Me Kate* (Hattie understudy), *Aspects of Love, Chicago* (Pop), *A Sentimental Bloke* (Rosie) & *Footloose* (Ariel). After moving back to her home town of Brisbane in 2004, Astin successfully auditioned for an ABBA tribute show and went on to play the role of Frida to many audiences across Australia. Since then Astin has appeared in a number of shows including *42nd Street* (Annie), *The Boy From Oz* (Sheena), *Oklahoma!* (Ado Annie), *Assassins* (Female Swing), *A Chorus Line* (Diana Morales), *Grease, The Wizard of Oz* (Aunt Em understudy), *Hairspray* (Amber) and *Little Shop of Horrors* (Ronette).


DRINCIDALS

Muzzy Von Hossmere I Jacqui Cuny


A graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium (Vocal Performance) and UQ (Drama), Jacqui began her professional acting career with the QTC in *Annie* and *The Circle* (1981). Mrs Meers I Sherryl-Lee Secomb


Born in Brisbane, Sherryl-Lee Secomb has worked constantly in community theatre for over 30 years in everything from farce, concert performances, plays and large scale musical theatre. These include performances in productions such as Fiddler on the Roof ('Golde'), Singin' in the Rain ('Zelda'), West Side Story ('Anita'), Guys & Dolls ('Adelaide'), A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum ('Phyllia'), Leonard Bernstein's MASS - Australian Premiere (Stage Cast, QPAC) and Anything Goes ('Reno Sweeney').
