THE STORY — ACT I

The play opens in the Forecourt of the White Geese Hotel with the Goslings, the six daughters of Paula the Proprietress busy at their household chores. The arrival of the soldiers creates some excitement but all are anxiously awaiting the return of Sylvia, Paula's adopted daughter. Sylvia is in love with Karl, the irresponsible lady-killer of the regiment, an attachment not encouraged by Paula. The arrival of Liane relieves Paula as she can see that by throwing Karl and her together, it may break up Sylvia's attachment for Karl. Slingsby arrives with his two henchmen, Leo and Theo, who are three adventurers with a wild cat scheme to make some easy money. Likewise, Felix, who is an amusing rogue, gets hopelessly involved in the complications brought about by his own intriguing. Count Franz Von Hollenstein visits the inn, falls in love with Sylvia, and asks Paula's permission to court her daughter but is rejected by Sylvia, believing herself still in love with Karl. However, Liane and Karl announce their intention of marrying and Sylvia then allows herself to fall in love with Franz.

ACT II

This act opens with a Mardi Gras Ball in the Salon of the Chateau Hollenstein. Everyone is eagerly awaiting the announcement by Count Franz that he was formally engaged to Sylvia. Felix is busy trying to find the lost crown princess, but believes her to be Liane. Slingsby and Co. also are doing their utmost to find her and also have a wild scheme to make a lot of money by transforming the Kingdom of Zilania into a modern Monaco. Several humorous episodes are exposed and it is not until the final scenes that the true plot is unfolded, with the discovery that Sylvia is the lost crown princess who will marry Count Franz. Liane and Karl are happily united; Felix misses out on every count; while Slingsby and Paula find an attachment and a subsequent business arrangement.
