From The Director

For me, the real protagonist in this show is the village of Anatevka. This represents a true community, committed to its simple Faith in God. The villagers live this practically in their everyday lives, all having their special roles in society. The characters, and the basis of the plot, come from the wonderful short stories of Sholom Aleichem. His stories of Jewish communities in Eastern Europe at the momentous turn of the Twentieth Century, including Tevye and his daughters, (originally seven!), mirror the social changes around them as seen in the lives of his vivid characters.

It has been a privilege for the production directors to work with the design team and the cast who have recreated our vision with such dedication. Especially I acknowledge Geoff for his innate sense of style and devotion to the music, and Lynette for her choreography which lovingly recreates the dances of the Jewish and Russian communities. My thanks must go to assistant director, Barbara Granato, whose valuable theatrical experience brought new perspectives.

I know several wonderful shows with music by Jerry Bock and lyrics by Sheldon Harnick, but this is perhaps one of the most universally appealing of all Broadway musicals, with such a tightly focused book by Joseph Stein, bringing vividly to life each character in Anatevka. Please laugh and cry with us as we too contemplate Anatevka with the *Fiddler on the Roof*.

Alec has been involved in community theatre since age 10, inspired by his early Drama teachers, his mother, Daphne and Gloria Birdwood-Smith. While a teenager, he performed in plays, pantomimes, and four Gilbert and Sullivan Operas. He joined Savoyards in 1976 and, with occasional forays to Mercury Theatre in Wynnum, Ignatians and La Boîte, has performed or directed with Savoyards for 30 years. His favourite roles: Max in The Sound of Music (Savoyards and Ignatians), any G & S role (especially Ko-Ko in The Mikado), Nathan Detroit in Guys and Dolls (Savoyards 2002), and Higgins in My Fair Lady (Savoyards 1999).

As a high school drama teacher, he has directed many plays and musicals. 1984 saw his directional debut with Savoyards in the first Fiddler on the Roof. Since then he has directed shows by Cole Porter (Anything Goes), Frank Loesser (Guys and Dolls, 1989), and several G & S comic operas, most recently The Yeomen of the Guard (2000).

The return to Fiddler on the Roof marks a long held dream, as this was the first professional musical he saw back in the mid 60s, and its simple themes of Faith, Hope and Love made a deep impression on a teenager, which continues to make this for him a very special musical.

From The Musical Director

"Splash!"

That was the sound of me being thrown in the deep end when I first 'met' Savoyards. I was asked to 'fill in' as conductor, at very short notice, for several performances of *Fiddler* in Sav's original production in 1984. And so it was good to be able to take on the role of Musical Director and be able to properly learn the show before standing in front of the orchestra and cast and presenting it to you this time.

Fiddler on the Roof is full of wonderful music, rich characters, good humour, and pathos, drawing as it does on the traditions and stories of the Hasidic Jews. So it follows that you won't find here the "normal" Broadway traditions of big

jazzy numbers, love songs and ballads, but instead a musical score which echoes the unique sounds, melodies and harmonies of the Jewish musical traditions. It has been a privilege to work with this magnificent cast, orchestra and production team to bring this all to life, and special thanks must go to Margaret Agnew for her untiring efforts at the piano during the weeks of rehearsal.

Geoff Secomb's involvement with music spans most of his life, starting with piano and theory lessons as a child, changing to clarinet as main instrument, and going on to tertiary studies. He graduated from the Queensland Conservatorium with a Bachelor's Degree and a Post Graduate Diploma, both majoring in Instrumental Performance. Geoffrey's performance experience began as a member of the Queensland Youth Orchestra's Wind Ensemble, leading on to four years as Principal Clarinet of the Qld Youth Symphony Orchestra, with whom he also appeared as soloist on several occasions. He has also worked as a freelance musician for many years.

Geoff is now a member of one of Queensland's leading community orchestras, the Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra, with whom he will be performing as soloist in the Concerto for Clarinet and String Orchestra by Arnold Cooke at their next concert on 19th November. He is also known by many of Queensland's leading performers and teachers as their instrument repairer of choice, as he runs his own business specialising in repairs and sales of wind and brass instruments, backed by his experience as a teacher and performer.

This is Geoffrey's ninth appearance as Musical Director for Savoyards, previous shows being The Sound of Music, The Sorcerer, Showboat, Anything Goes, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Hello, Dolly!, Guys and Dolls and West Side Story.

From The Choreographer

Lynette commenced Highland Dancing at the age of 5 and through the years has passed exams, competed, taught and is now a fully qualified adjudicator. As well as learning Highland Dancing, Lynette has also studied Jazz and Tap which she says have all been invaluable to her when she has danced in theatre productions and later when choreographing various shows.

Oklahoma! was Lynette's first amateur theatre production in 1980 with the Ignatians Musical Society. Since then she has danced in many shows with various theatre companies around Brisbane. Lynette has been choreographing for approximately 15 years and thoroughly enjoys seeing a show develop from the auditions through to the opening night.



She has choreographed many shows in and around Brisbane with some of the most recent productions being *Kismet*, *Brigadoon*, *Snapshots From Home*, *As You Like It*, *Patience*, the children's Christmas musical *Humbug* and *The Little Mermaid*.

This is her fourth production for Savoyards. The first was *The King and I* in 2000 followed by *Brigadoon* in 2003 and most recently *Oklahoma!* in 2005. Lynette is thrilled to be on the production team for *Fiddler on the Roof* as it is a show very close to her heart.

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Terme - Steve Trollope

Steve is delighted to get the opportunity to perform the role of Tevye, one of the best roles in musical theatre. Steve moved from Adelaide to Brisbane in 1999 and this is his first musical production since then. However he performed in many musicals and plays during his 13 years in SA including, Tevye (twice), Peron in Evita, Sky Masterson in Guys and Dolls, Wild Bill Hickock in Calamity Jane, Police Sergeant in Pirates of Penzance, Pooh Bah in The Mikado and Alfred P Doolittle in My Fair Lady. This Production however is especially important to him because, along with Tevye's five stage daughters, Steve has his own two daughters in the cast with him.



Motel - Reindert Toia

Reindert began performing at the age of 5 in Savoyards' production of The King and I. His first professional engagement was as a featured character in World EXPO 88 Kids Co. He then went on to perform in the Queensland Ballet's Alice and the New Zealand Ballet's Coppelia. Working with Walt Disney special events, Reindert has toured Australia, Indonesia and Singapore. The highlight of his career, however, was performing as a tap dancer in the Duke Theatre on 42nd Street as part of the New York City Tap Festival. Reindert is currently developing, with friends, a new company called "Those Tap Guys".



Perchik - Andrew Herrmann

Andrew returns to Savoyards after performing as the apostle Andrew in Jesus Christ Superstar. He has performed roles with Sunnybank Theatre Group including Frank Butler in Annie Get Your Gun, Leonard Vole in Witness for the Prosecution, Dr Rex Forbes in Play On! and Vernon Hinse in *The Pajama Game*. When not rehearsing Andrew studies piano with Barbara Poole and performs with the comedy trio, Jim's Men.



Fyedka - Tristan Ham

Tristan began his singing career at the age of 11 as a tenor in his primary school choir and began professional vocal coaching at the age of 18 with Jason Barry-Smith. He has since sung with the Queensland Youth Choir, Brisbane Chorale and was in the 2005 concert production of Spellbound. He is fairly new to the musicals scene, with his first performance in last years Ignatians production of Les Misérables. Still a tenor 10 years later, Tristan is looking forward to performing in his first, and hopefully many more productions, with Savoyards.

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Golde - Sherryl-Lee Secomb

Sherryl-Lee has a long performance history in musicals carrying on a family tradition that is almost as old as Savoyards. With Fiddler, she is excited to watch her children (themselves fourth generation "Savoyards") take to the theatre. Enjoying character & comedy roles, Sherryl-Lee has appeared in many shows over the last 25 years, her favourites being with Savoyards in *Guys and Dolls* (Miss Adelaide) and *West Side Story* (Anita), *Singin' In The Rain*, and the Australian premiere of Bernstein's *Mass* with the Queensland Conservatorium. Sherryl-Lee has loved the role of Golde and thanks the wonderful Savoyards cast for the opportunity to work with them again.

Tzeitel - Vanessa Wainwright

Since joining Savoyards in 2000 Vanessa has been involved in many productions, both on stage and off, including *The King and I* (chorus), *Kiss Me Kate* (chorus), *South Pacific* (Nellie Forbush), *Les Misérables* (chorus), *Brigadoon* (Assistant Director), *Savs on Broadway* (Director), *Crazy For You* (Irene Roth), *West Side Story* (Teresita – Shark), *Hello, Dolly!* (Minnie Fay), *Oklahoma!* (chorus), and most recently Lina Lamont in *Singin' In The Rain*. Vanessa has also appeared as a soloist in Savoyards concerts. She is a graduate of a Bachelor in Creative Industries (Drama) from QUT, and has enjoyed the challenge of playing Tzeitel in *Fiddler on the Roof*.

Hodel - Angela McMullin

Jesus Christ Superstar (2006) saw the return of Angela to Savoyards after a ten year absence. Angela started with Savs in 1987 in the chorus of Hello, Dolly!. In 1989 she performed in back to back Savoyards productions of Oklahoma! (Ado Annie) and Guys and Dolls (Sr. Sarah). In Nunsense (1995), as Sr. Mary Leo, she fulfilled her secret ambition of becoming a dancing nun! Last year she performed at Twelfth Night Theatre in the Frank Sinatra Tribute, My Way. She is currently studying Theology in Thornlands and has enjoyed the "Fiddler" experience of fun, friendship and matchmaking!

Chava - Natalie Lennox

Fiddler on the Roof is Natalie's tenth consecutive show with Savoyards. She has played a number of minor lead roles including Bonnie Jean (Brigadoon), Patsy (Crazy For You), Graziella (West Side Story), dream Laurie (Oklahoma!), Die Fledermaus, Jesus Christ Superstar, Singin' In The Rain and Guys and Dolls. Natalie has also choreographed Hello, Dolly! for Savoyards. She has been dancing all her life and has completed an Advanced Diploma of Arts (dance performance). Outside of performing, Natalie is studying a double degree in Physiotherapy/Exercise Science and also teaches at the Australian Dance Performance Institute. Natalie feels privileged to be playing such a beautiful role.





The Place: Anatevka, A Small village in Russia
The Time: 1905, on the eve of the Russian Revolutionary Period

The action takes place in 1905 in the village of Anatevka in Russia, near Poland. Tevye is the dairyman for the poverty-ridden Jewish community who staunchly uphold their traditions in the village of Anatevka in Tsarist Russia. He and his long suffering wife, Golde, have five daughters, the three eldest of whom ponder the future men in their lives. Meanwhile, Yente, the village matchmaker, is arranging a marriage between Tzeitel, the eldest daughter and Lazar Wolfe, the town's wealthy butcher. While returning home, Tevye meets Perchik, a university student and would-be social reformer, whom he invites to Sabbath dinner, and to teach his younger daughters the Scriptures. Tevye meets Lazar Wolfe and agrees to the wedding. But Tzeitel loves Motel, the village's poor struggling tailor. She pleads their love, and Tevye gives his blessing. But he has to stage a fake dream for Golde, who, putting great store by the interpretation of dreams. agrees to the change in grooms. The wedding celebrations take place, but are marred by an antijewish demonstration organised by the Tsarist Government to distract the Russian populace from the demonstrations which were taking place to call for democratic reform. Hodel, the second daughter, expresses a wish to marry Perchik for love. Tevye agrees, even though it means she must go far from home to join Perchik who has been arrested. Pondering this new kind of love, not an arranged marriage, but freely chosen, Tevye asks Golde if she really loves him. Their third daughter, Chava, also wants the same freedom to marry, but her choice is Fyedka, a Russian Christian, a gentile. Tevye cannot accept this blow, this break with tradition, and learning of their marriage, he denies she exists, but later relents a little as he still loves his daughter. The Tsar has commanded that Jews must leave Russia for new destinations. All the villagers of Anatevka gather their belongings and begin to scatter to safer areas in the world. Tevye and his family pack to begin the long journey to a new country and a new life.

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
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
