

From the Director / Choreographer ~ Ruth Gabriel

I have to admit that when the movie first came out I saw it eleven times! Well, I was only twelve. I loved the beautiful music, the romantic story, the spectacular mountain scenery and the lovely city of Salzberg. Later, as my interest in, and knowledge increased, I came to admire the scale and sweep of the cinematic directorial style. It has been a joy to work with all the cast - who have responded with intelligence, enthusiasm and a professional attitude. I must especially thank Matthew Nutley for his insisting efforts to make the show a success. Right from the auditions, Kathleen and he both helped me to keep sane. I would like to thank the Savoyards Committee for their tremendous help and support. Finally, I would like to thank all the parents of the children who have driven countless miles, and sat through innumerable rehearsals. My feverent wish is that you enjoy our production, and leave the theatre transported and uplifted once again by the tuneful music, the impression of the beautiful mountains and the message of hope and belief that the story portrays.

Ruth started walking and talking and, according to her mother, never stopped. So, it seemed only natural that she should spend a considerable amount of time 'showing off' in the theatre. Having commenced dancing at the age of five, she continued until injury intervened, and she started directing about twenty years ago. In her teenage years and early twenties, she performed with the Queensland Light Opera Company as dancer and Ballet Mistress, while completing High School and gaining a Teaching Diploma. She travelled to London to become Margot Fonteyn 'the 34th' but soon realised that she really enjoyed the creative process much more, so she returned to Brisbane and took over a ballet studio and commenced teaching dance and stagecraft with Guiseppe Sorbello at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, while choreographing with Lyric Opera, Queensland Ballet, Arts Theatre, Shoestring Company, Ignatians, Harvest Rain and many school productions. For Savoyards, Ruth has choreographed and/or directed Lola Montez, Fiddler On The Roof, Me And My Girl, The King And I, Brigadoon, Die Fledermaus and Singin' In The Rain. "My Favourite Things are beautiful music, theatre, sarsaparilla, Chinese food and quiet, peaceful days to read."

## The Sound of Music

The final collaboration between Rodgers & Hammerstein was destined to become the world's most beloved musical.

When a postulant proves too high-spirited for the religious life, she is dispatched to serve as governess for the seven children of a widowed naval Captain. Her growing rapport with the youngsters, coupled with her generosity of spirit, gradually captures the heart of the stern Captain, and they get married.

Upon returning from their honeymoon they discover that Austria has been invaded by the Nazis, who demand the Captain's immediate service in their navy. The family's narrow escape over the mountains to Switzerland on the eve of World War II provides one of the most thrilling and inspirational finales ever presented in the theatre.

I have also been honoured to work with a fantastic orchestra, from the first rehearsal their energy and enthusiasm was fantastic. The Sound of Music means different things for different people. Some people love it, others block their ears as soon as you start to hum any one of the many familiar and favourite tunes. I hope that you will gain great joy tonight and may even find someone to annoy this week as you will still be singing the songs this week of this classic piece of Musical Theatre.

Matthew has had a long association with Savoyards and Musical Theatre. At only 23 years of age, he has already been Musical Director for 3 musicals (Singin' In The Rain, Cabaret, The Sound of Music) and 4 concerts. Matthew has also been Assistant Musical Director for many productions including FAME: The Musical (Beenleigh), Nunsense & Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (Sunnybank), Les Misérables & Jesus Christ Superstar (Savoyards). In 2003, Matthew played keyboards for Cabaret at the Lyric Theatre, Brisbane. Matthew has also appeared in many productions including West Side Story, Oklahoma!, and Hello, Dolly!. When not at a rehearsal, Matthew is a music teacher with Forte School of Music at Toowong. Assistant Musical Director ~ Kathleen Lamont



Mother Abbess ~ Bernadette Alizart




Herr Zeller ~ Greg Johnson






