Willkommen, Bienvenue, Welcome!

One of Isherwood's most unforgetable characters, Sally Bowles, inspired playwright John van Druten to adapt The Berlin Stories for the theatre. The play I Am a Camera, was produced in New York in 1951 with Julie Harris in the lead role. A film version was produced in 1955. Then, in 1966, Hal Prince transformed the enduring work into the ground-breaking musical, Cabaret, with Joe Masteroff's book and a magical score by the team of John Kander and Fred Ebb. Bob Fosse's acclaimed movie version of the musical followed in 1972, staring Joel Grey and Liza Minnelli in what would become their signature performances.

Synopsis

On a train to Berlin is Clifford Bradshaw, a young American writer who has been roaming Europe in search for the inspiration for novel number two. He is joined by Ernst Ludwig, who is in the smuggling business. When Cliff inadvertently helps, Ernst gratefully gives him the name of a boarding house, Fräulein Schneider. It's New Year's Eve and Ernst has mentioned a cabaret, the Kit Kat Klub, which seems far more appealing to Cliff than a typewriter, ... of he goes. At the Kit Kat Klub there is a cross section of Berlin nightlife where anything goes. Cliff meets the club's madcap but not overly gifted young British singer, Sally Bowles. After being sacked, she arrives on his doorstep the next day - bags in hand and pleads with Cliff to let her stay. Fräulein Schneider is being courted by a Jewish fruit shop owner. Herr Schultz who also lives in the boarding house. Across from Cliff is Fräulein Kost, a prostitute who has more sailors than a battleship. Cliff is getting nowhere with his novel, Sally is pregnant and they are both having mixed emotions about life in general. Things turn sour when at Fräulein Schneider and Herr Schultz's engagement party Ernst learns about the Jew and decides to leave but is lured back by cost and the guests who sing a Nazi song. With the engagement between Schneider and Schultz called off and Nazism rising. Cliff decides to take Sally home to America. She loves life there though, including the Klub. After a savage argument Sally disappears, returning the next having aborted Cliff's child. Sally is now trapped in her delusion. On the train Cliff begins to write about Sally and the memory of Berlin. We now get a sense that Cliff's novel will not only document the place and people, but the moment the world turned on it' axis and changed forever. (Cabaret, Playbill Pty. Ltd.; 2003)



Gordon Ball

For well over thirty years, Gordon has performed many leadings roles including Cap't Andy in Showboat, Billy Bigelow in Carousel, Curly in Oklahoma! and many more. His favourite roll was Don Quixote in Man of La Mancha. After moving from Sydney, where he directed a number of shows including West Side Story, The Sentimental Bloke, and The Vagabond King among others, he was delighted to direct PRIMA's first major musical Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dream Coat which thrilled audiences throughout Brisbane. He has since directed Annie, and was delighted to be asked to direct Cabaret for Savoyards.

On researching Cabaret, I found a Berlin night life that was dark and seedy, and a society that was Bohemian to say the least. My challenge was to bring this lifestyle and the onset of Nazi Germany to you, being shocking on one hand and being entertaining on the other. Cabaret can only be presented with team work; starting with Savoyards executive and there team of helpers through to the production team and cast. Thanks to Matthew for his enthusiasm to the music and cast, Tamsin with her inventive choreography, and Jo who has been so strong and helpful to us all. I hope you can sit back and enjoy Cabaret for what it is "A Great Night At The Theatre"



On stage, off stage, in the pit ... there's nowhere Matthew hasn't been. Born with it in his blood, Matthew is an all-round theatre-nut. In 2003, he played keyboard for Cabaret at the Lyric Theatre, QPAC. This started a passion for not only Cabaret but musical direction. Matthew has been involved musically with Singin' in the Rain, Jesus Christ Superstar, Les Misérables (Savoyards), FAME (Beenleigh Theatre Group) and Nunsense! (Sunnybank Theatre Group), as well as several concerts for Savoyards and other community organisations. On stage credits include Hello, Dolly!, Oklahoma!, West Side Story, Die Fledermaus, and Crazy For You. He works as a piano teacher and is very excited to be involved with Savoyards' production of Cabaret. "Even the orchestra is beautiful!"

When I think of Cabaret, I think of Shrek, Shrek explains that an ogre is like an onion - it has lavers. Cabaret is very much the same with the exterior of the seedy Kit Kat Klub and the darker layers of the rise of Hitler. These are reflected in the music through the Emcee's social comentary. The 'little bit naughty' "Two Ladies". through to the ever haunting "I Don't Care Much". I have really enjoyed working with such a talented and dedicated cast, production team, orchestra and crew. Hopefully another similarity is that both Cabaret and onions leave a little tear in your eye!

Cabaret is Tamsin's twelfth show as Choreographer. She has choreographed almost all of the G&S collection as well as Fiddler on the Roof, Rodgers, Hart and Hammerstein, and The Belle of New York. On stage, she appeared in Dad's Army with Jon English at Twelfth Night Theatre. She has a Bachelor of Arts in Applied Theatre (Event Management) and has studied an Advanced Diploma of Arts Dance. Recent shows include Cats, Les Misérables, Jesus Christ Superstar, and Lois Lane in Kiss Me Kate. She was Entertainment Co-ordinator for the Kessel Run Star Wars Convention and Production Director for Buffy the Vampire Slayer the Musical. She currently works at Sea World and Australian Outback Spectacular.

In setting the choreography, I wanted the movement to be sexy, whilst still staying true to the period of show (Burlesque, set in the 30's'). I wanted to challenge everyone with their movement, both with technical dance moves, and taking them 'out of their comfort zone' with intimate and provocative moves and poses. Everyone embraced these challenges, which was evident from their hard work, and their obvious dedication to making everything look great. I've really enjoyed having the opportunity to work with such an amazing group of people. Thank you so much for all your hard work, I appreciate it. You are all Beautiful!
